Cary Representative on Triangle Transit Board Ends 20 Years of Service

Research Triangle Park, NC (February 25, 2009) - When North Carolina's Secretary of State signed the Articles of Incorporation that created the governing board of Triangle Transit, Robert (Bob) Hinshaw of Cary was there. Now, 20 years later, Hinshaw is stepping down today from the transit agency he's helped to guide for two decades.

In recognizing Hinshaw's work on the Board of Trustees, Board Chair Bill Strom said, "Bob is a planning professional who in his years on Triangle Transit's board has taken his decision to perform public service to a remarkably high level. He has consistently kept his focus on the best interest of Triangle Transit's riders and employees. All the communities in our service area owe Bob a debt of gratitude."

Hinshaw, a former Cary Town Councilman, will be replaced by Cary's Mayor Pro-Tem Julie Aberg Robison. She has been a Cary resident since 1997 and is in her second term on the Council. Robison is a Senior Public Administration Specialist at the Research Triangle Institute.

Triangle Transit is governed by a 13-member Board of Trustees. Ten members are appointed by the region's principal municipalities and counties to staggered four-year terms. Three ex officio non-voting members are appointed by the North Carolina Secretary of Transportation. The Board of Trustees possesses the general legislative powers of Triangle Transit and meets on the fourth Wednesday of every month at 4600 Emperor Drive, Suite 100, Durham, NC.
